1. Igloo Flower Shop

The owners of Igloo were hoping to re-open. STRA had suggested that they might have some narrow shelves, within the alcove outside the shop, where flowers could be displayed, alternatively, it might be possible to open window completely and have displays on a wide shelf/window sill.

2. Local benefits for STRA network

The Core group would look into securing advantages for the STRA network, e.g. extending the London BID deal card to Shad Thames; making local deals already available known to the network, (such as that if a hot drink is bought at All-Bar-One you can help yourself to breakfast); reduced ticket prices at the Old Vic; etc.

3. Cleaner, greener, safer application

NS and MP had met Nick Stanton, and Southwark's Head of the public realm on 2 June 2009 and had walked around the Shad Thames area, the outcome was that the area would be surveyed to make sure that at least all general maintenance had been carried out; a contact person would be identified. The walk around had looked at access to the Horseleydown old stairs, and the way in which QE Street might become one-way, and notification that replacement of water pipes would begin in December.

4. Butlers Wharf riverside walk

Southwark Council are now monitoring the garbage collection in the area. Brett Collins, White Druce Brown, would be asked to provide a schedule for garbage collection, cleaning and replacement of light bulbs.

5. London BID

The London BID to be asked if there would ever be any possibility of Shad Thames being included in the area.

6. Riverside Parents and Carers Group

After the meeting with the RPC, and taking the issues they had raised to the PFPMT, they would be given feedback.
